COURSE OUTLINE

DESCRIPTION:

Rediscover your forgotten French! This swift paced refresher course is designed for quick learners who already possess some French background and too advanced for the basics. Quickly review grammar and vocabulary to converse and express your ideas. Improve listening comprehension skills and practice French pronunciation and reading in French. An action oriented approach to learning will have you on the road to speaking French again sooner than you thought.

COURSE GOALS:

The purpose of this course is to:

- Revive students' previous knowledge of French language
- Reinforce listening and oral skills in French language
- Generate confidence in the use of French language

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

At the completion of this course students will be able to

- Conduct conversations of everyday life in French
- Understand a wide range of spoken conversations and oral texts
- Compose grammatically correct sentences in French
