

French-The Basics Part I LANG6301

Course Outline

Description: Have you always wanted to learn the language of love? Designed for the beginner, this course develops a basic vocabulary, explores fundamental grammar, pronunciation and verbs. You will develop your French Communication skills by learning to ask and answer simple questions in a variety of practical situations.

Course Goals: As an Introduction to French the aim of this course is to provide the participants with a basic understanding of how the language <u>"works"</u>. We will study for example, basic vocabulary and expressions, alphabet, numbers, basic regular and irregular verbs... The importance of basic grammar and proper pronunciation will be addressed through study and systematic practice of the <u>French sounds</u>, <u>rhythm, grammar and simple communicative topics.</u>

Course Objectives: At the completion of this course, the student will be able to: be able to understand elementary vocabulary and verbs. Asking and answering simple questions as studied in-class interaction and in practice.

Attendance Requirements:
