

French at Noon: The Basics Part I

LANG6351

Course Outline

Description: This course is an introductory level course intended for beginners or students with very little French knowledge. In this 10 week course, you will learn basic vocabulary and explore fundamental structures and grammar within a communicative context. Upon completion of the course, you will be able to communicate on a basic level and will have a fundamental knowledge that would allow you to continue to develop your French skills in the future.

Course Goals:

The aim of this course is to provide participants with a basic understanding of the French language. We will study the alphabet, basic vocabulary and expressions in a number of different subject areas, as well as commonly used verbs that will allow students to engage in conversation at an elementary level. The course will focus on developing oral communication skills. Students will be expected to participate in oral activities on a regular basis; the activities aim is to provide the opportunity to practice the content in context and to maximize the practice of oral comprehension and expression in class.

Course Objectives: At the completion of this course, the student will be able to understand elementary vocabulary, ask and respond to questions related to subject areas discussed in the class.

Attendance Requirements:

Students must miss no more than two classes to receive a completion for this course. A grade report can be printed from myWCS.
